Dear Mr Kingsley

As the sitting Borough Councillor for Brancaster Ward, Norfolk I should like to inform you of my counter proposal to that of the King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council which I put forward for consideration.

At present the Ward consists of Brancaster, Brancaster Staithe, and Burnham Deepdale to the East and Thornham, Titchwell and Choseley to the West, all villages within the Saxon Shore Benefice along with Old Hunstanton and Holme next the Sea. Ringstead lies 2miles inland.

There is a coherence to these villages as all but Ringstead and Choseley lie on the Norfolk Coast within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. They are all in close proximity to the North Sea and all share common issues of second homes, planning, affordable homes, employment, coastline management and tourism.

My counter proposal would be to combine all these villages in a predominantly coastal Ward as follows:

Brancaster. Present number of electors. 448
Brancaster Staithe with Burnham Deepdale. 364
Titchwell 74
Thornham 380
Choseley. 16
TOTAL at present. 1282

Add
Holme next the Sea Present number of electors. 208
Ringstead 271
Old Hunstanton. 370

GRAND TOTAL. 2131

This would be close to the recommended optimum of 2,300 which you request and geographically would be practical for single Councillor representation.

In the past ten and a half years I have represented all these villages as Borough Councillor albeit in two different wards and I am very familiar with the aims and ambitions of these communities and of their unique geography which is why I feel confident In putting forward this proposal. I have the support of all the Parish Councils within this proposal.

Please give this your urgent consideration
