**Re: Local Government Boundary Commission – Review of Electoral Arrangements:

I write to express my objections and concerns regarding your draft proposals for the future Electoral arrangements within Lancaster and Morecambe.

As a resident of Morecambe I would like to support Morecambe Town Council's views as set out overleaf. There are two basic principles within your proposals which concern me:

Firstly, I am very concerned that Morecambe would be under represented when compared to the Lancaster. This seems very unfair particularly as the proposals appear to have come about due to the large number of students within Lancaster, a transient population who do not contribute to local Council tax.

Secondly the proposed redrawing of the Morecambe Town Council ward boundaries appears inconsistent and would create confusion and division amongst existing and well defined communities within Morecambe.
