Comment text:

Brinton Parish Council is not happy with your proposal, and it does not seem that the comments made in a letter sent to the Review Officer on 3rd September have been taken into account. We confirm that we believe that the parish of Brinton (which is proposed to be put in a new Stody Ward) does not have anything in common with the larger conurbations such as Melton Constable, Saxthorpe and Corpusty, or indeed Edgefield; and from a geographical point of view the latter three parishes in a proposed elongated Ward do not provide a cohesive unit for a District Councillor to represent. Brinton and Sharrington are more closely associated with the nearby small villages proposed to be placed in a Priory Ward and we hope that you will reconsider the matter before confirming your proposal. Furthermore it is believed that the larger populated areas can be more effectively represented by a Councillor even if they are in a ward with more electors than a combined number of small parishes. Therefore the optimum number of electors for each of the 40 (the proposed reduced number) District Councillors need not be as high as 2070 for a new rural ward if our request is granted. Our preference is for Brinton to be in a group of parishes such as Letheringsett, Field Dalling, Langham, Briningham, Hindringham, Gunthorpe, Thursford, Thornage, Stody and Binham.
