Comments: Buckingham Town Council discussed the letter sent by Mr. William Morrison the Review Officer sent on the 21st of October. Members wished to highlight the large increase of houses both already built in Buckingham and due to be built in the near future. There is currently planning permission for 700 houses in Buckingham South and approximately 300 houses have planning permission in Buckingham North. Since 2001 a further housing estate has been built in Buckingham South and a number of infill housing has also been undertaken in both wards.

As a result of the increase in housing (and resultant increase in electors) the Council felt that the wards around Buckingham may need to be altered with the creation of a third ward to cover part of Buckingham and the surrounding area.

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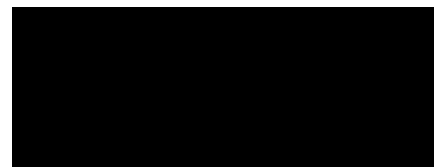

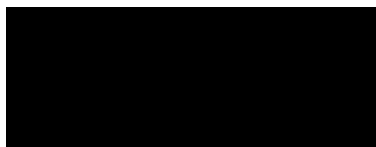
ELECTORAL REVIEW OF BUCKINGHAMSHIRE
