Feedback: There is a very good argument for suggesting that no change would be far fairer than an artificial reduction which has no clear rationale. Any change could have a negative effect on voting turnout and would only contribute further to the confusion in many people's minds about the electoral system and who their local government representatives are. If a change is deemed absolutely essential, such a change must take into consideration the existing natural boundaries (roads, railways and river) not to mention the 'hard' boundary of the Greater London boroughs of Kingston and Richmond, as well as community interests (sporting, religious, childrens' groups etc)- in which case the only reasonable change would be to move the roads immediately behind Hinchley Wood School to the Hinchley Wood, Claygate and Oxshott division or, if this is impractical because of the impact on that division, then the roads to the west of the railway line in Claygate should be moved to the Esher Division.
