Subject: The boundaries of Churt Parish Council

Dear Sirs

I would like to register the interest of a number of inhabitants of Hale House Lane, Churt, in changing the boundary of the Churt Parish Council to include the western end of Hale House Lane, which is prima facie a part of the village of Churt, and not of the village of Frensham. The anomaly has arisen because this part of the lane is included, for reasons of numbers, I believe, in the parliamentary ward of Rushmoor. When Churt Parish Council separated from Frensham Parish Council, Rushmoor Ward, was linked with Frensham rather than Churt. Geographically and historically, there is no sense in including Rushmoor, and, in particular, the few houses at the western end of Hale House Lane, with Frensham. We support clubs, societies and church in Churt, and have nothing to do with Frensham. We are not geographically connected with Frensham in any way. I have written to Frensham and Churt Parish Councils asking for their support.

We have no problems in being associated with the parliamentary ward of Rushmoor, we do want to be associated with Churt Parish Council for administrative purposes.
