I have represented Great Lever ward for the last 15 years. The residents of the above streets see themselves very much as part of the Great Lever community. The Burnden Shopping Centre next to these streets is also not part of Bolton Town Centre which is in Queens Park Ward.

I think the above streets and Burnden Shopping Centre should remain in the new Great Lever ward and I request that boundary of the proposed Great Lever and Queens Park wards should be Lever Street and Rosehill across Manchester Road continuing eastwards to St. Peters Way. This will have very limited impact in terms of electors (142 approx).

I hope you will give my request serious consideration.
