Hi Paul

Just to let you know that a report is going to Council on 15 December to support the Commission's draft warding pattern that is currently out for consultation – this is attached. I understand that there may be one or more amendments moved on the night, one of which is related to a tweak in the boundary between Nethermayne and Pitsea South East wards – the

attached map refers and the detail with reasoning is as follows:

- Kingswood Court, Bardfield Road and Kent View Road with the three homes on Clay Hill Road to move from Nethermayne ward to Pitsea South East ward. It keeps this community together and makes a clear boundary.

The other potential amendments relate to ward renamings and the one I know of concerns a proposal to rename St Martin's ward to Barstable ward – a name which carries historical weight as Barstable was one of the original Essex hundreds. I am uncertain of the other potential amendment so will let you know after Council.
