I believe the local ward boundary should follow the neighbourhood plan agreed for Aston Clinton which has now been adopted and follows the parish council boundary. Aston Clinton is unique in character and has its own issues quite separate from that of Weston Turville which forms part of the Aylesbury conurbation and garden town scheme which Aston Clinton does not. The characters of both Weston Turville and Buckland and Aston Clinton are very different and hence the settlements share no common facets at all apart from being located near to one another and hence both should be separated from the Aston Clinton ward boundary as denoted in the neighbourhood plan. Buckland is fast becoming one big monolithic industrial estate in the south of the A41 at College Road North which is totally different in character to Aston Clinton as Birmingham is to Stratford Upon Avon. Aston Clinton has a population of over 4,000 people and by aligning the ward and parish boundary together the population would reflect similar wards in Bucks including Central Aylesbury of 3,854, Bierton of 1,704, Cheddington of 3,028, Edlesborough of 2,852, and Pitstone of 3,688 according to the Aylesbury Vale Central Locality Profile It had been agreed in the adopted neighbourhood plan that Aston Clinton should remain as a discrete village location with a defined boundary and aligning the parish and ward boundary would achieve this rather than let the industrial overspill from College Lane N engulf the village or the garden centre town scheme that appears to concrete over everything in its path that is the Aylesbury Vale Masterplan Aylesbury has been ranked the worst place in the country to live and in their defence Aylesbury Town Council said - well there must be worst places, not let's energise Aylesbury find out what residents want, invest in the town and improve the quality of life for its citizens This shows you the problem an apathetic town council, a district council hell bent on building over everything to make up the shortfall in their budgets through a council tax grab and residents who feel the town has lost it being a mixture of poor quality sixties housing, poor town planning and acre after acre of concrete paths and fallen trees So let's keep Aston Clinton a separate village and prevent it being taken down as Aylesbury slowly sinks into the mire
