This is an appalling consultation - with it being listed against Buckinghamshire County Council when it relates to Buckinghamshire Council, and elsewhere it even refers to Buckingham Council. And if this relates only to the size of the Council why does this form have a map on it? In response to the specific question, I believe the size of the Council should be in the range of 80 - 120, comprising two members per ward. I would allow the precise number of wards to be determined by the way in which logical ward boundaries can be formed ... using current Wards would result in 98 members. Any variation from this would reflect on the need to achieve consistency in the number of electors in each ward. The case presented by Buckinghamshire Council for 120 members appears to rest on their current ways of working. If the number of members is smaller then they will need to change those ways of working to be more efficient - and reduce the cost of running the council.
