We would like to be considered to come under the Boughton Monchelsea Ward, not Parkwood, currently we come under ParkWood but would like to come under Boughton Monchelsea for both Ward and Parish.

Our connections to Boughton Monchelsea is that our children both attended the Boughton Monchelsea village hall playgroup at Church Street, as well as attending Brownies, and Scouts.

Our daughter attended Boughton Monchelsea School for the full duration from reception to the end of the junior year before then going on to attend what was then called Cornwallis, now known as the Academy.

We now have Grandchildren, & visit Boughton Monchelsea recreation park, as well as the church in Church Hill to see the deers,. There are also such lovely country walks which we indulge in, as well as the village holding a lot of history which is educational both for adults and children.

Our Grand child was christened at St Peters Church in Boughton Monchelsea, Church Hill by the Reverent [REDACTED]. The church itself is a historical landmark.
