

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Waverley?

• The Commission has a legal duty to carry out an electoral review of each council in England 'from time to time'.

Our proposals

- Waverley Borough Council currently has 57 • councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 50 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 - 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
 - 2. Reflect community interests and identities
 - 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that Waverley should have 50 councillors, seven fewer than there are now.

Waverley should have 24 wards, five fewer than there are now. The boundaries of all wards will change.

The 50 councillors should represent five three-councillor wards, 16 two-councillor wards and three one-councillor wards across the council area.


