Comment text:

I am very concerned about the consequences of proposed boundary changes affecting Peopleton. The proposed boundary map shows a bottleneck of land crossing the A44 as if it's a natural link. But it isn't . We really aren't connected. We don't have a footpath, or a bridge, or any form of safe crossing point. We don't even have a regular bus service. We don't identify with Drakes Broughton, which is rapidly expanding like Pershore itself. Instead, we have historic, religious, educational and social links with White Ladies Aston, Cowsden, Upton Snodsbury, Churchill ... all villages within the natural triangle formed by the A44, A46 and A422. Small villages have different issues from small towns - we worry about conservation and hedgerows, farm traffic and mud, flooding, rural crime, rural planning, traffic speed - all the issues that we have in common with the other villages in the area. We rely on decisions that preserve and encourage rural identity which makes this county - and this country - so desirable. I fear that the proposed boundary change would be entirely detrimental to Peopleton and I see no reason to support it.
