SUBMISSIONS TO LOCAL BOUNDARY COMMISSION 2023

- a. 3 houses (31,33, and 35) Swan Street to move from Norton to Wollaston. These are an anomaly in that the rest of Swan Street is in Wollaston & Stourbridge Town. The Boundary continues North into Cobden Street on both sides as part of Wollaston & Stourbridge Town.
- b. The Wollaston & Stourbridge Town side of Park Road (Evens) to move to Norton. There's no logic here. It isn't a main thoroughfare and it would even out the numbers between the two wards in a small way as there is more building currently in Wollaston.
- c. Houses between Park Road West and Gladstone Road to move from Norton to Wollaston. This makes sense to tidy up the border between the two wards. It would mean that Park Road and Park Road West would make a more natural boundary between the two.
- d. King Street, Pearson Street and all of Crabbe Street to be moved from Cradley to Lye.

King Street, Pearson Street and all of Crabbe Street to be moved from Cradley & Wollescote to Lye & Stourbridge North. These streets are closer to the centre of Lye than any affinity to Cradley & Wollescote. Crabbe Street is currently split between Cradley & Wollescote and Lye & Stourbridge North. It makes more sense for residents too.
