### **Our Recommendations**



### Our proposals

- North Tyneside Council currently has 60 councillors. Based on the evidence we received. we recommend that 60 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
  - 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
  - 2. Reflect community interests and identities
  - 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

### Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that North Tyneside should have 60 councillors, the same as there are now.

North Tyneside should have 20 wards, the same as there are now. The boundaries of all existing wards should change.

The 60 councillors should represent 20 three-councillor wards across the borough.
