Overall, we believe that the current ward boundaries for Kirklees Council represent the communities they cover reasonably well. A small number of the wards are quite large, and it might be appropriate to move ward boundaries slightly so that communities can be better represented. Some communities are split across ward boundaries, and it would be appropriate to move them into one ward.

The number of residents in the Lindley Ward is quite large, and it may be appropriate to move those who live to the east of the A629 into the Greenhead Ward. Mount is split between the Lindley Ward and the Golcar ward and it may be appropriate to keep that community together by moving it into the Golcar Ward. Quarmby is also split between Lindley Ward and the Golcar Ward and it may be appropriate to move the whole of Quarmby into the Golcar Ward.

The community of Paddock is split between the Golcar Ward and the Greenhead Ward, the largest part of it being in the Greenhead Ward. It might be appropriate to move the parts of Paddock around Royds Hall/Longwood Rd/Lowergate into the Greenhead Ward to keep that community together.

The number of residents in the Ashbrow Ward is quite large while the number of residents in the Dalton Ward is relatively low. Some equalization of the number of residents could be achieved by moving the community of Bradley into the Dalton Ward.

The number of residents in the Holme Valley South Ward is relatively large while the number of residents in the Holme Valley North is relatively low. Whilst some adjustment of the boundary between these two wards would equalize the number of residents it may be difficult to do this without splitting communities.

The number of residents in the Mirfield Ward is quite large and the number of residents in adjacent Heckmondwike Ward is quite low. Some adjustment in the boundary between The Mirfield Ward, Heckmondwike Ward and Dewsbury West ward might be appropriate.

The number of residents in the Dewsbury South Ward is quite large and an adjustment of the boundaries between it and Dewsbury East; Dewsbury East and Batley East; a change to the boundary between Batley East and West and a movement of residents from Batley East into the Birstall and Birkenshaw Ward might improve the representation for those communities.

The community of Paddock is split between the Golcar Ward and the Greenhead Ward, the largest part of it being in the Greenhead Ward. It might be appropriate to move the parts of Paddock around Royds Hall/Longwood Rd/Lowergate into the Greenhead Ward to keep that community together.

The number of residents in the Ashbrow Ward is quite large while the number of residents in the Dalton Ward is relatively low. Some equalization of the number of residents could be achieved by moving the community of Bradley into the Dalton Ward.

The number of residents in the Holme Valley South Ward is relatively large while the number of residents in the Holme Valley North is relatively low. Whilst some adjustment of the boundary between these two wards would equalize the number of residents it may be difficult to do this without splitting communities.

The number of residents in the Mirfield Ward is quite large and the number of residents in adjacent Heckmondwike Ward is quite low. Some adjustment in the boundary between The Mirfield Ward, Heckmondwike Ward and Dewsbury West ward might be appropriate.

The number of residents in the Dewsbury South Ward is quite large and an adjustment of the boundaries between it and Dewsbury East; Dewsbury East and Batley East; a change to the boundary between Batley East and West and a movement of residents from Batley East into the Birstall and Birkenshaw Ward might improve the representation for those communities.
