## Electoral Review of Cannock Chase District Council

On behalf of Brindley Heath Parish Council, thank you for the opportunity to make observations on the Boundary Commission for England's Electoral Review of Cannock Chase District.

The Boundary Commission is looking to reduce the number of councillors from 41 to 36 but has not as yet proposed any new wards, preferring to hear what residents and organisations think about the current boundaries and where the new boundaries should be sited.

At this initial stage of the review the Parish Council feels unable to provide detailed comments but would ask that the Commission bears in mind that Councillors are worried about the impact of boundary changes on the parishes.

Brindley Heath Parish is the oldest in the Cannock District and Councillors feel strongly that the boundary continues to encompass Cannock Chase, keeping it as a coherent whole in the interests of maintaining a voice to look after and protect this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty into the future.
