ELECTORAL REVIEW OF BLABY DISTRICT COUNCIL: DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has published proposals for new electoral arrangements for Blaby. A summary is attached.

The electoral arrangements for your parish council may change because of our proposals. Please find attached a map outlining the proposed electoral arrangements for your council.

We propose that 36 councillors should be elected to Blaby in future. We also propose new ward boundaries across the authority.

A public consultation on the proposals will run from 1 February 2022 to 11 April 2022.

Once we have considered all responses to the consultation, we aim to publish final recommendations in July 2022. We will then lay a draft order in both houses of Parliament. Subject to parliamentary scrutiny, the new electoral arrangements are scheduled to come into effect at the authority's elections in 2023.

We considered all representations received from local people and organisations during our initial consultation when drawing up our proposals. We have sought to balance statutory criteria we must follow when drawing up these proposals, and we seek to:

- Make sure that, within an authority, each councillor represents a similar number of electors
- Create boundaries that are appropriate, and reflect community ties and identities
- Deliver reviews informed by local needs, views and circumstances

We are now inviting comments on the proposals before we finalise the new electoral arrangements in your area. We will consider every response we receive during the consultation period and will weigh each response against the criteria above.
