Comment text:

I have been a resident of Hady for over 40 years and strongly object to your latest proposals for the changes to the ward boundaries in the Hady area. The proposal that Hady should be in a ward with Harland is flawed for the following reasons: The road you refer to in your consultation document between Hady and Harland is narrow and difficult to navigate by vehicles due to the number of parked cars. It is also difficult for pedestrians as the footpath changes from one side to the other at a point where it is difficult to see approaching cars so most people walk on the road. There is no direct bus service between Hasland and Hady. The regular route goes through Spital as the two communities are closely connected. Apart from secondary school children attending school in Hasland, both Spital and Hady residents identify with the town centre as there are clear road, bus and walking routes to the town centre. People in Hady and Spital access GP services mostly in the town centre. There are much closer links with Spital as primary age school children attend the same school. Consequently there are established walking routes between the two areas. Both communities identify with the town centre for places of worship and local amenities like doctors and dentists and shopping. Both communities are in the Church of England parish of St Mary's and All Saints, the Crooked Spire, in the town centre. I believe, therefore, that Hady should remain in the same ward as Spital and the town centre.
