General comments: 1. If each ward only has one councillor, then if that councillor becomes say a cabinet member, the service to the ward will suffer. 2. Riverside ward is far too big and should be broken up. 3. Kirkdale ward is far too big and is set to get bigger still if and when the new flats are built. 4. Central ward by contrast is too small. It should expand either North into Vauxhall or South into Riverside. It should contract a little at the Eastern end: the terraces on Kensington (Albert Edward Road etc) should not be in it. 5. Try not to change the polling stations more than you have to. Specific comments on Princes Park ward: I have lived in Princes Park ward (Kelvin Grove, in PPD) for over 30 years and have a few years experience of organising political canvassing for that area. There is a big cultural difference between the 'Park Road end' and the 'Lodge Lane end' and the councillors I have worked with have tended to gravitate to one end or the other. So it would help both ends for the ward to be subdivided. I anticipate you will maintain existing polling district boundaries and that is nearly (but not quite) right. 1. Districts PPB, PPC and PPE should remain. 2. In district PPA, the southern boundary should be Upper Warwick Street, so the area between Upper Warwick and North Hill goes into PPD. 3. PPD should split: remove the part south-west of Admiral Street and put that in with PPF. 4. The area between Upper Parliament Street, Park Road, Windsor Street and Northumberland Street should be detached from Riverside ward and brought into PPF. 5. Maybe subdivide PPF using North Hill Street as the border, thus creating PPF and PPG. Having done all that, I suggest that PPA, B, C and E belong together as a new Granby ward. Then PPD and PPF and PPG can become a new High Park ward.
