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## **West Northamptonshire Labour Submission**

This document, along with the associated maps and spreadsheets, constitutes the submission of the Labour group on West Northamptonshire Council to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England regarding new electoral arrangements for West Northamptonshire Council (WNC).

The Labour group supports the recommendation that West Northamptonshire Council should in future be represented by 77 councillors and proposes a pattern of 41 wards, made up of 11 three-member wards, 15 two-member wards and 14 single-member wards. In general, our presumption has been in favour of multi-member wards in urbanised areas and single-member wards in rural areas. We recognise the advantages of multi-member wards for many purposes, but in parts of West Northamptonshire drawing a multi-member ward will of necessity require dozens of parishes to be included in a single ward and we do not feel that such scattered, amorphous wards would be easy to represent, would foster a sense of community, or would contribute to effective local governance.

In putting together our submission, we have had regard to a number of factors. Firstly, we recognise the importance of parishes as the basic building block of local government and have avoided splitting them whenever possible. Three civil parishes (Daventry, Kingsthorpe and Northampton) are too large to be contained within a three-member ward in their entirety and accordingly must be divided between multiple wards. However, elsewhere we have split only one other ward, and then only because it is clear that the parish arrangements no longer reflect local identities or settlement extents.

Secondly, we have had regard to the importance of roads as both uniting and dividing factors. In rural areas, where most villages are not large enough to provide all basic services and residents accordingly need to visit neighbouring settlements to access eg schooling and GPs, roads may be considered as an important shared interest and we have accordingly sought to create wards which are centred around major transport arteries. In urban areas, roads (along with rivers and railway lines) often form clear boundaries between areas and to the maximum extent possible we have sought to respect such dividing lines.

Thirdly, we have considered shared community interests and have sought to connect areas which face shared challenges and utilise the same range of services. Evidence for such community links is provided in our descriptions of our proposed wards.

Finally, we have considered the current and previous patterns of wards at county, district and unitary level, on the basis that it makes sense to keep areas that are accustomed to being represented together in the same wards. This is particularly important in Northampton, where the previous borough wards continue to exist (with some very slight modifications) as the wards of Northampton Town Council.

In calculating electorate figures, we have used elector counts by polling districts. Where it has been necessary to divide polling districts, we have used a variety of methods to try to estimate the proportion of the electorate in each half of the polling district but have strived to ensure that our proposed wards will be robust against any inaccuracies in these estimations.

Prior to the formation of West Northamptonshire Council, the area was covered by three district/borough councils, namely Daventry, Northampton and South Northamptonshire. West Northamptonshire has three area committees covering the areas of the former district councils and many services are still delivered according to this basic pattern. Accordingly, our submission

preserves this basic division, with a few minor modifications to reflect likely changes to parliamentary boundaries and the expansion of the Northampton urban area.

We have created this submission through an extensive process in which we consulted residents, parish councillors, community groups, council officers and West Northamptonshire Councillors (across all parties).

### **Daventry sub-area**

In addition to the form Daventry district council area, this sub-area also includes six parishes from the former South Northamptonshire district council area. Four of these parishes are extreme west of the former South Northamptonshire district council area, namely Aston-le-Walls; Boddington; Chipping Warden and Edgcote; and Eydon. These parishes constitute a panhandle from the former South Northamptonshire district council area and are remote from other parts of the former district council area, with the nearest urban centres being Daventry, Banbury and Southam (the latter two of which are in Oxfordshire and Warwickshire respectively.) Two of these parishes, namely Harpole and Kislingbury, are separated from the rest of the former South Northamptonshire district council area by the M1 motorway and have shared interests with areas formerly in Daventry district council to their north.

On the other hand, it excludes a small area of the parish of Boughton which is functionally an extension of Kingsthorpe.

We propose a two-member **Woodford & Byfield** ward made up of the parishes of Aston le Walls; Badby; Boddington; Byfield; Canons Ashby; Catesby; Charwelton; Chipping Warden and Edgcote; Everdon; Eydon; Farthingstone; Fawsley; Hellidon; Newnham; Preston Capes; Staverton; and Woodford cum Membris. Woodford Halse is a large village which acts as a service centre for villages between Banbury and Daventry. Byfield and Woodford share a GP surgery and children in Byfield attend primary school in Woodford and vice versa. Several villages in the ward are linked together by the 200 bus service between Daventry and Banbury. By 2028, the councillors for this ward would represent 2% more electors than average.

We note in passing that Woodford cum Membris and Byfield could form a single-member ward, as could the remaining fifteen parishes. It is certainly the case that Woodford Halse and Byfield share close enough connections to be a viable single-member ward. We have not proposed such an arrangement because we are unsure that the remaining villages have sufficient community affinity for each other to constitute a suitable single-member ward, but if such evidence is adduced then we would not be hostile to that kind of arrangement.

The town of Daventry is the second largest settlement in West Northamptonshire after Northampton, and it lies to the west of the M1 between Northampton and Rugby. It grew up as a small market town, but in the aftermath of the second world war it saw major expansion with the growth of several new estates around the historic centre, many of which housed families resettled from Birmingham. More recently, Daventry has seen significant quantities of new housing in the north of the town, along with the development of a number of industrial estates and distribution centres around the Braunston Road.

To reflect the two stages in which the town has grown, we propose that the bulk of Daventry should be represented by one three-member ward and one two-member ward. The three-member ward, which we propose should be named **Daventry South**, would consist of the town centre and the

nearby estates of Drayton, the Grange, the Headlands, Southbrook, and Steffen Hill. This would cover the polling district ADE2, ADE3, ADW1, ADW4, ADW6 and ADW7. The boundaries of the ward would run from the eastern parish boundary along Eastern Way, then northwards along Northern Way, then westwards along the southern edge of Daneholme Park, then northwards along Ashby Way, then along the backs of properties between Roderick Way and New Forest Way, then in a south-westerly direction along the edge of the playing fields until Braunston Road. From there it would run in a westerly direction along Braunston Road until reaching the parish boundary.

The communities in this ward are primarily composed of mid-century estates, many of whose residents have lived there for generations. They are in close proximity to the town centre and share many services with each other such as Daventry Food Bank and the GP surgeries on London Road and Eastern Way. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 2% more electors than average.

The two-member **Daventry North** would then be made up of the rest of Daventry, except for the Middlemore area to the north of Drayton Reservoir. This would comprise the ABC13, ADE4, ADE5, ADW2, ADW3 and ADW5 polling districts, together with that portion of the ABC12 polling district lying south of Drayton Reservoir. These areas are predominantly made up of new-build estates where community identities are still emerging. Shared interests for these residents include the GP surgery on Wimborne Place and the employment locations along Drayton Way and Braunston Road. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent approximately 3% fewer electors than average.

The remaining area of Daventry is the Middlemore estate. This estate is separated from the rest of Daventry by Drayton Reservoir and effectively functions as a stand-alone village, with its own village store and with a Residents association. It is currently associated with villages to the north of Daventry in the Braunston & Crick ward, and we believe that its interests will continue to be best served by being combined with villages rather than with Daventry proper.

Accordingly, we propose a single-member **Braunston & Middlemore** ward, comprised of Middlemore and the parishes of Ashby St Ledgers, Braunston, Norton and Welton. This ward would combine settlements which are in close proximity to Daventry, but which are separated from the continuous urban area of the town and share an interest in ensuring that separation. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent approximately 2% fewer electors than average.

To the south-east of Daventry, we propose a single-member **Weedon** ward made up of the parishes of Brington; Brockhall; Dodford; Flore; Stowe-Nine-Churches; Weedon Bec and Whilton. Weedon Bec functions as a local centre for the surrounding villages for grocery shopping and access to a GP and a pharmacy. The villages also have shared interests due to their close proximity to the major transport arteries of the A5 and the M1 roads. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 7% more electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Crick** ward made up of the parish of Barby and Onley; Crick; and Kilsby. These parishes are composed of larger villages defined by their proximity to the M1 and M45 motorways and the Daventry International Rail Freight Terminals and accordingly their economies are heavily influenced by the logistics sector. Their nearest town is Rugby in Warwickshire, and they look here for many services rather than to elsewhere in Northamptonshire. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 4% fewer electors than average.

We propose a two-member **Long Buckby** ward made up of the parishes of Althorp; Creaton; East Haddon; Holdenby; Hollowell; Long Buckby; Ravensthorpe; Spratton; Watford; and West Haddon. This ward is centred upon the large village of Long Buckby, which functions as a local centre for surrounding villages and whose train station is used by travellers in a wider area. The villages in the

ward are connected together by the A428 road and the 96 bus which runs from Northampton to Rugby. The majority of these wards are also united within the present Long Buckby ward. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 4% fewer electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Harpole & Harlestone** ward made up of the parishes of Harpole; Harlestone; Harlestone Manor; and Kislingbury. This ward comprises parishes immediately to the west of the Northampton urban area which are affected by their proximity to the M1 motorway and to new developments in and around Northampton. In particular, expected developments around Sandy Lane span the parishes of Harpole and Harlestone Manor and it makes sense to unify these developments in a single ward. We note that Harlestone Manor had its own parish council created in 2020 and we feel that this indicates that the area has a separate identity from the more established community of Duston. The communities in this ward exist on the periphery of the urban area but are not part of it and we feel that this distinction should be respected. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 9% more electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Welford** ward made up of the following parishes: Clay Coton; Cold Ashby; Elkington; Guilsborough; Lilbourne; Naseby; Sibbertoft; Stanford; Sulby; Thornby; Welford; Winwick; and Yelvertoft. This ward connects parishes in the north-west of the authority which sit in close proximity to the A14 trunk road. The low populations of these parishes means that few of the villages are able to maintain a wide range of services, but Guilsborough does function as a local centre because it is the location of Guilsborough Academy secondary school and the primary schools within this ward mostly serve pupils from several villages. In drawing the boundary between this and our proposed Walgrave & Clipston ward, we have had regard to historic primary school catchment areas. By 2028, the councillor this ward would represent 2% fewer electors than average.

Immediately to the north of Northampton, we propose a three-member **Moulton** ward, which would be made up of the entirety of the parishes of Church and Chapel Brampton; Moulton; Overstone; and Pitsford and almost the entirety of the parish of Boughton. These are all villages which are defined by their proximity to Northampton, but which retain a separate identity from the main urban area. There are substantial quantities of new housing being developed here, especially in Overstone and Boughton. New housing in the area of Park View spans the parish boundary between Moulton and Overstone and we therefore feel that they must be considered as a single unit. Each of the parishes has its own primary school, but secondary school pupils in the area generally attend Moulton School and Science College and further education opportunities are provided by Moulton College. Moulton also has a GP surgery and a post office which serve the surrounding villages.

The part of the parish of Boughton we do not propose to include is the Dixon Road area off Boughton Green Road. This area is functionally an extension of Kingsthorpe and is separated from Boughton village by open countryside. Children here attend All Saints CEVA Primary School just across Boughton Green Road and links with Kingsthorpe are strengthened by the nearby new housing development on the Park Campus site (previously used by the University of Northampton.)

In contrast, we do feel that the Buckton Fields area of Northampton should continue to be warded with Boughton Village. Although Buckton Fields is situated close to Kingsthorpe, it is not part of Kingsthorpe. Notably, the road network for Buckton Fields does not connect to neighbouring areas of Whitehills or Spring Park and it is not covered by the Whitehills & Spring Park Residents Association, who opposed the development of Buckton Fields. Given the competing interests of these two communities, we feel that Buckton Fields is best served by being represented separately from Kingsthorpe and that it should continue to share a councillor with Boughton village.

All the areas in our proposed Moulton ward are also in the present Moulton ward. Aside from the Dixon Road area mentioned above, the other areas removed are the parishes of Spratton, Holcot, Hannington, Old and Walgrave, all of which are more remote from Northampton and look much less to Moulton and Northampton than the parishes retained in the ward. By 2028, councillors for our proposed ward would represent approximately 8% fewer electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Brixworth** ward covering the eponymous parish and nowhere else. Brixworth is an ancient village, well-known for its large Anglo-Saxon church. It grew significantly in the latter part of the twentieth century and is the largest settlement between Northampton and Market Harborough. School children attend Brixworth Primary School, and the village has a wide range of amenities. In view of its much greater size than the villages to the north, east and west, we feel that Brixworth has a distinct set of interests from them and should accordingly constitute a single-member ward. By 2028, the councillor for such a ward would represent 3% more electors than average.

Finally, we propose a single-member **Walgrave & Clipston** ward made up of the parishes of Arthingworth; Clipston; Cottesbrooke; Draughton; East Farndon; Great Oxendon; Hannington; Haselbech; Holcot; Kelmarsh; Lamport; Maidwell; Marston Trussell; Old; Scaldwell; and Walgrave. Although this is a greater number of parishes than we would ordinarily assign to a single ward, this is reflective of the notably low population density in the area to the north of Pitsford Water. This means that relatively few services are able to be provided locally and that the public transport is weak, but the parishes are well connected by the A508 road between Northampton and Market Harborough. Many of the parishes in the ward are too small to sustain a primary school, but pupils there generally attend a school in a neighbouring village and in drawing the boundary between this and Welford ward we have had regard to traditional primary school catchment areas. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 3% fewer electors than average.

### **Northampton sub-area**

We define the Northampton sub-area as the former Northampton Borough Council area minus the parish of Great Houghton and plus the parish of Grange Park and areas in neighbouring parishes which are effectively extensions of Northampton. Grange Park is effectively an urban extension of Northampton, similar in character to Wootton to the north and separated from the bulk of the former South Northamptonshire district by the M1 to its south. Accordingly, it makes more sense to consider it with nearby areas of Northampton. Conversely, Great Houghton is a separate village, isolated from Northampton by the Brackmills industrial estate and the A45 trunk road. Local children often attend Little Houghton Church of England Primary School, outside the former Northampton Borough Council area and it is similar in character and interests to the other villages along the A428 road to Bedford.

Within Northampton, our submission recognises that there are a number of clear dividing lines within the town formed by major roads, the railway line and the river Nene. To the maximum extent possible, we have attempted to respect these dividing lines and to avoid having wards which traverse them.

In the east of the town (commonly known as the Eastern Districts), we recognise that both the A43 (Lumbertubs Way) and the Wellingborough Road (the A4500) divide communities. Accordingly, we propose that there should be two two-member wards to the east of the A43 and the north of the Wellingborough Road.

Compared to the present ward of that name, we propose that **Talavera** should be represented by two councillors rather than three and that it should be limited to areas to the west of Lings Way, along with the Southfields estate to the north of Talavera Way. This would comprise the entirety of the BTV1, BTV3 and BTV5 polling districts, together with the overwhelming majority of the BTV2 and BTV4 polling districts.

This would create a clear, coherent ward with lines that are easily recognisable on the ground. It would be made up of the estates of Lings, Lumbertubs, Thorplands and Southfields. Lings and Lumbertubs are served by the same local shops and GP surgery, and both have close links to the Weston Favell Centre to the south. The two areas are both covered by Brookside Residents Council and constitute the Brookside ward on Northampton Town Council. The number 1 bus route connects both areas to Thorplands and the number 5 bus route connects Lings to Southfields. There are four primary schools in the area (two of which are part of the same trust), local teenagers attend Northampton Academy, and the area is also served by Billing Brook School which is a special SEND school.

By 2028, councillors for our proposed Talavera ward would represent 3% fewer electors than average.

We also propose a new two-member **Blackthorn & Rectory Farm** ward primarily based on those parts of the former Billing and Rectory Farm ward located north of Wellingborough Road. This ward would consist of the estates of Blackthorn, Rectory Farm, Goldings, and Overstone Lodge together with the Woodland Walk area and the Lingswood Park area. This would comprise the entirety of the BBR1, BBR2, BBR3, BTV6, CBR7, CBR8 and CBR9 polling districts, together with small portions of BTV4 (Woodland Walk) and BTV2 (Lingswood Park).

Blackthorn and Rectory Farm have historically been linked through neighbourhood organisations, community facilities and shared bus routes. Blackthorn Academy and Rectory Farm Primary School are closely linked and currently share the same headteacher. At present Overstone Lodge is divided, with most of it falling into Talavera ward but areas to the east of Foxcovert Wood being in Billing & Rectory Farm. Our proposal would reunite this community.

Lingswood Park backs on to the Woodfield development (adjoining Blackthorn) and both are in close proximity to Lings Wood, the playing fields, the skateboard park, and the old independent school. Having the same councillors covering both areas will assist in resolving issues relating to these areas. Woodland Walk is significantly closer to Bridleways and Rectory Farm than to Southfields and therefore fits much better in a ward with the former areas than with Southfields.

By 2028, councillors for our proposed Blackthorn & Rectory Farm ward would represent approximately 10% fewer electors than average.

To the south of the Wellingborough Road sits the parish of Billing, which is presently divided between wards, with most of it in the Billing & Rectory Farm ward but with Little Billing and parts of Billing in Riverside Park ward. Local councillors have consulted Billing Parish Council on this issue and their preference is for the parish to be united in a single ward. Accordingly, we propose a two-member **Billing** ward made up of the eponymous parish and two neighbouring areas with road access only on to Little Billing Way (namely Longford Avenue and the streets off it and Stockmead Road and the streets off it) which hence look to Billing as much as they do to nearby areas of Standens Barn. Additionally, we also propose that the ward should gain areas around Billing Aquadrome to the south of the A45. The polling districts in our proposed ward would be CBR4, CBR5, CBR6, CRP1 and a portion of CRP7.



Unfortunately, it is not possible to provide a pattern of wards which crosses neither the A43 nor Wellingborough Road whilst providing acceptable levels of electoral equality. At present the Riverside Park ward crosses the A43 south of Wellingborough Road and we accordingly consider that this is the best place to have a ward crossing from the Eastern Districts to the rest of Northampton. Reflecting this, we propose a two-member **Weston** ward covering most of Standens Barn together with the Weston Favell and Abington Vale areas west of the A43. This ward would have strong boundaries along the A45, Rushmere Road/Park Avenue South, Wellingborough Road, and Little Billing Road. It would comprise the entirety of the CRP2, CRP3, CRP4, CRP5 and CRP6 polling districts, together with those portions of CRP7 not in Billing and those portions of CDR7 to the east of the centreline of Rushmere Road. Almost all of these areas are already in the Riverside Park ward and are accordingly accustomed to being represented as a unity.

By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent approximately 4% more electors than average.

We propose slight modifications to the current **Headlands** ward to restore electoral equality and to maintain it at three councillors. Headlands has very clear boundaries along its eastern, western, and southern sides (the A43 Lumbertubs Way, Park Avenue North and the Wellingborough Road respectively) and we propose maintaining these. On its northwestern side we propose that the boundary should continue to be Greenfield Avenue (which marks the boundary between the Spinney Hills and Eastfield areas of the town) and on its northeastern side, we propose that it gains polling district BBP3, which covers the Lakeview Estate around Churchill Avenue.

This is a cohesive community with a distinct identity from neighbouring areas of Boothville and it has its own facilities, such as the post office on Churchill Avenue and the community rooms at Eden Close. This area has strong links with the Eastfield area to the south. Many children in Eastfield attend Boothville Primary School on Booth Lane North and many children on the Lakeview Estate attend Eastfield Academy. The two communities have strong interests in Eastfield Park, which is primarily accessed via the footpath leading from Greenside to Skiddaw Walk and members of both communities are involved in the Friends of Eastfield Park which is a voluntary community organisation which seeks to enhance the park and its amenity for local residents.

Eastfield itself is a cohesive community which should not be divided. Important community institutions include Broadmead Community Church and St Albans Church, whilst both it and the Headlands area are served by the Shop Zero food larder.

This means that the ward would be comprised of the following polling districts: BBP3, BHD1, BHD2, BHD3, BHD4, BHD5, BHD6 and BHD7. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 9% fewer electors than average.

We propose slight modifications to the boundaries of the current **Boothville & Parklands** ward and that the new ward should in future be represented by two councillors rather than three. The ward presently has strong boundaries along its eastern side (the A43 Lumbertubs Way) and its western (Bradlaugh Fields). The southern boundary with Headlands has been discussed above.

We acknowledge that some residents of the Moulton Leys area identify with Moulton, but we have not been able to find an acceptable warding pattern that accomplishes this without dividing communities elsewhere (particularly around Eastfield). However, we would note that there is good access between Moulton Leys and the rest of the ward via Moulton Way; that Moulton Leys is in fact part of the parished area of Northampton rather than Moulton, and that Moulton Leys has been consistently warded with other areas of Northampton at district, county, and unitary levels since at

least 1974. Accordingly, residents are accustomed to being considered as part of Northampton and we do not feel it would pose difficulties for them if this were to continue.

We therefore propose that Boothville & Parklands should be made up of the areas currently covered by the BBP1, BBP2, BBP4, BBP5, BBP6 and BBP7 polling districts. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 4% fewer electors than average.

We propose a three-member **Kingsthorpe North** which closely resembles the present ward. To restore electoral equality, we believe Kingsthorpe North should gain the Kingsthorpe Village area, which is covered by the BKS1 polling district. This reunites the Kingsthorpe parish ward of Kingsthorpe parish within a single ward and means that the ward would be composed of the parish wards of Kingsthorpe, Sunnyside, and that part of Obelisk parish ward north of Holly Lodge Drive. This would create a strong boundary with Kingsthorpe South along Holly Lodge Drive, Boughton Green Road, Harborough Road, and the Kingsthorpe-Northampton parish boundary. It would be comprised of the entirety of the BKN1, BKN3, BKN4, BKN5, BKN6, BKN7 and BKS1 polling districts and that portion of the BKN2 polling district north of Holly Lodge Drive. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 3% fewer electors than average.

We propose a two-member **Kingsthorpe South** which closely resembles the present ward. It would lose the Kingsthorpe Village area (the BKS1 polling district) to Kingsthorpe North and would gain the portion of the BKN2 polling district south of Holly Lodge Drive, together with the part of Boughton parish south of Holly Lodge Drive. This would create strong and easily observable boundaries between Kingsthorpe North and Kingsthorpe South and would unite the new community being created by developments around the site of the former Park campus of University of Northampton. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent the average number of electors.

We propose that the current **St George** ward should be almost unmodified, merely losing its portion of Kettering Road adjoining the Racecourse and becoming a two-member ward. This ward has strong boundaries along the south (the Racecourse and the inner ring road, the west (the Brampton Nene and the railway line), the east and the north (Bradlaugh Fields.) The ward is made up of communities in close proximity to the town centre and the communities have a shared focus upon Malcolm Arnold Academy, which receives secondary school pupils from across the ward. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 6% more electors than average.

We propose slight modifications to the boundaries of the current **Abington & Phippsville** ward and that the new ward should in future be represented by two councillors rather than three. The ward presently has strong boundaries along its southern side (Billing Road) and eastern side (Park Avenue North/Park Avenue South, along with the natural boundary of Abington Park) and we would maintain these. On the northern side, the boundary presently runs down the middle of Kettering Road, except opposite the racecourse where it runs along the backs of houses on Kettering Road. We suggest a minor amendment to the boundary here so that it runs along the middle of Kettering Road continuously from the junction with Park Avenue North to Derby Road.

On the western edge of the ward, we propose a slight modification to the boundary. At present it runs along St Edmund's Street and Alfred Street, and we propose that in future it should instead run along East Street and the western edge of Billing Road Cemetery. This would have the effect of removing the present CAP7 polling district out of the ward, leaving the new Abington & Phippsville composed of the polling districts BAP1, BAP2, BAP3, BAP4, BAP5 and BAP6. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 4.5% more electors than average.

We propose slight modifications to the current **Castle** ward to restore electoral equality and to maintain it at three councillors. Castle has very strong borders upon its southern, western and northern boundaries in the form of the river Nene, the railway line and the Racecourse and we would be opposed to any ward crossing these barriers.

On the eastern side, clear dividing lines between communities are less immediately apparent. We suggest that Castle's boundary with Abington & Phippsville should be altered by moving the CAP7 polling district and that it should in addition take in the area between Cheyne Walk and Rushmere Road (all of the CDR8 polling district and the western half of CDR7). Much of this area is non-residential and is taken up by Northampton General Hospital, Three Shires Hospital, St Andrew's Hospital and Northampton School for Boys. However, what residential housing there is here has high proportions of flats and faces similar challenges as neighbouring areas currently within Castle ward.

By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 1.5% more electors than average.

The parish of Far Cotton & Delapre is separated Northampton town centre by the river Nene, which forms the northern boundary of the parish. The eastern boundary of the parish is the A45 trunk road, the southern boundary is the Mereway section of the ring road, and the western boundary is the railway line. To the west of Far Cotton & Delapre lies the Briar Hill area of Northampton Town Council. Briar Hill is a 1970s estate, bounded on two sides by the ring road, on one side by the river Nene and on the remaining side by the railway line. Both the ring road (which is two lanes in either direction in this stretch and which is difficult to cross on foot) and the river are clear barriers to community identity.

However, this is much less the case for the railway line (which in this stretch largely runs through a cutting on the approach to the Hunsbury Hill Tunnel) and Briar Hill's major road link to the rest of Northampton runs along Rothersthorpe and through Far Cotton. Many community facilities are shared between the two areas, including Briar Hill Community Centre, the foodbank at Food Aid Far Cotton, Brownie and Cub Scout groups. The area is served by four primary schools (Briar Hill, Delapre, Abbey and Queen Eleanor), each of which takes children from both Briar Hill and Far Cotton. Teenagers in both areas attend Abbeyfield Secondary School in Delapré. Briar Hill does not have its own GP surgery and many local residents will accordingly use Delapré Medical Centre on Gloucester Road.

We therefore propose a three-member **Delapre & Briar Hill** ward, with the same boundaries and name of the prior Northampton Borough Council ward. The polling districts concerned are CDR1, CDR2, CDR3, CDR4, CDR5, CDR6, CSF1 and CSF2. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 10% fewer electors than average. Whilst this is a higher electoral variance than we would normally prefer, in view of the extremely strong links of Far Cotton and Briar Hill (and the extremely poor links of Briar Hill with any other nearby areas) we consider this to be the best option.

North of the River Nene and east of the railway line, there are three wards of Northampton Town Council, namely St James, Spencer, and Kings Heath. The bulk of this area currently falls within the Dallington Spencer ward, whilst a few small areas are currently in Duston East and parts of St James are in the Sixfields ward. We propose that instead the entirety of these three parish wards (equating to the CDE7, CDS1, CDS2, CDS3, CDS4, CDS5, CDS6, CDS7, CSF3 and CSF4 polling districts) should henceforth constitute the **Dallington Spencer** ward, which should continue to be represented by three councillors.

This ward would have strong boundaries along the railway line, the River Nene, the Upton Way section of the ringroad, Tollgate Way, Bants Lane, Harlestone Road and Dallington Heath. Different

areas of the ward are linked together by the 8 and 9 bus routes and the employment sites at Sixfields, St James' End and Lodge Farm Industrial Estate constitute a strong shared interest. Primary school children attend Kings Heath Primary Academy; St Mary's Catholic School; Earl Spencer Primary School; St James CoE Primary School; or Lyncrest Primary School. The Camrose Early Years Centre serves this community and Dallington Park provides valuable community open space at the centre of the ward. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 9% more electors than average.

To the west of the Northampton Town Council area lies the parish of Duston. Duston was originally a separate village which has been subsumed by the expansion of Northampton's urban area, but which maintains a separate identity. The parish is served by five primary schools and secondary school pupils attend The Duston School on Berrywood Road. The 9 and 15 bus routes both loop through the parish and community facilities are provided by the Duston Community Centre. The parish has strong boundaries along its eastern (Harlestone Road), southern (Bants Lane/Tollgate Way), western (Berrywood Road/the backs of properties along Southfield Road) and northern (Sandy Lane and Dallington Brook) edges.

Accordingly, we propose a three-member **Duston** ward comprised of the parish and nowhere else. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 1% more electors than average.

To the south-west of Duston lies the parish of Upton, which is comprised of three communities. To the north of Weedon Road lies St Crispins, to the south of Weedon Road is Upton Meadows and to the south of Upton Country Park is Pineham. To the east of Pineham is the parish of Hunsbury Meadows. Children in both Pineham and Hunsbury Meadows attend Pineham Barns Primary School. Almost all the housing in these communities is of recent construction, having been built in recent decades as part of the 21<sup>st</sup> century expansion of Northampton. Prior to the abolition of Northampton Borough Council, the parishes of Hunsbury Meadows and Upton formed the Upton ward.

We propose that a new two-councillor **Upton** ward should be established on the same boundaries. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 8% more electors than average. This ward would have an extremely strong boundary to the east along the ring road and the A5123 road. These roads are dual carriageways in both directions and the latter is a national speed limit road and they are not easy to traverse on foot. To the south the boundary is the M1 motorway, to the west the edge of the Northampton urban area and to the north the parish boundary with Duston.

We propose a three-member **Hunsbury** ward in the area bounded to the south by the M1 motorway, to the east by the A45 trunk road, to the north by the ring road (Mereway/Danes Camp Way) and to the west by the A5123 dual-carriageway. This encompasses the parishes of East Hunsbury, West Hunsbury and Collingtree. East and West Hunsbury are suburban extensions to Northampton, largely constructed during the 1980s and 1990s. Whilst Collingtree was originally a separate village, the construction of the M1 motorway cut it off from its rural hinterland and it has also seen suburban development in the shape of Collingtree Park.

Many secondary school pupils here attend Wootton Park School, which is in the ward. A large supermarket at Mereway and associated retail outlets are widely used by this community. The ward contains a number of parks, most notable Hunsbury Hill Country Park, which is widely used by the community for leisure purposes and contains the iron age hillfort from which the name Hunsbury originates. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 9% more electors than average.

To the south and east of the A45 trunk road, we propose a three-member **Wootton** ward comprised of the parishes of Grange Park, Hardingtonstone and Wootton and that part of the parish of Hackleton which comprises the Wootton Fields development. This would be a successor to the present Nene Valley ward, but we propose a change of name since only the very northern tip of the ward actually approaches the Nene. Both Hardingtonstone and Wootton were formerly independent villages which have been absorbed into Northampton and undergone suburbanisation, with Wootton in particular being primarily made up of housing built since 1980. Further south, Grange Park was built as a new settlement in the early 2000s. All of these communities are similar in character and have similar interests in regard to the expansion of Northampton. Children in all three areas attend Caroline Chisholm Secondary School.

New development (Wootton Fields) has overspilled the parish boundaries of Wootton, especially in the area of Poppyfield Road. Whilst this housing falls into the parish of Hackleton, residents there look towards Wootton for services and accordingly we feel they should be placed in the same ward as Wootton.

By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent approximately the average amount of electors for West Northamptonshire.

### **South Northamptonshire Sub-Area**

We define the South Northamptonshire sub-area as the area covered by the former South Northamptonshire district, plus the parish of Great Houghton and minus the parishes of Aston-le-Walls; Boddington; Chipping Warden and Edgcote; Eydon; Grange Park; Harpole; Kislingbury; and the portion of the parish of Hackleton covering Wootton Fields. As discussed above, this takes account of the historical distinction between the constituent elements of West Northamptonshire, whilst adapting to the urban extension of Northampton.

We propose a single member **Cogenhoe & The Houghtons** ward made up of the parishes of Brafield on the Green; Castle Ashby; Cogenhoe and Whiston; Denton; Great Houghton; Little Houghton; and Yardley Hastings. This ward is made up of small villages on or in close proximity to the A428 road between Northampton and Bedford. Most of these villages are served by the 41 bus and local children attend primary schools in Little Houghton, Cogenhoe, Denton and Yardley Hastings. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 4% fewer electors than average.

We also propose a two-member **Hackleton & Roade** ward, comprised of communities on both sides of the M1 motorway. It would be made up of the parishes of Ashton; Blisworth; Courteenhall; Easton Neston; Hackleton; Hartwell; Milton Malsor; Quinton; Roade; Shutlanger; and Stoke Bruerne, except for that part of the parish of Hackleton which is part of Wootton Fields. Whilst it is true that the M1 is a clear boundary, we have not been able to derive a satisfactory pattern of wards which allows us to avoid crossing it in this part of the authority. Moreover, two separate roads (between Courteenhall and Quinton and between Hartwell and Salcey Forest) bridge or tunnel over the M1 in this stretch and there are shared interests around access to the recreation area of Salcey Forest. To the west of the M1, the parishes in this ward are connected by the A508 road and by many footpaths, including the towpath along the Grand Union Canal. Along the west of the ward, there is a clear boundary along the A43 road and to the south the boundary is the river Tove. Secondary school pupils throughout the ward attend the Roade campus of Elizabeth Woodville School. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent approximately 3% more electors than average.

We propose a two member **Deanshanger** ward, made up of Northamptonshire villages within the orbit of Milton Keynes. It would contain the parishes of Alderton, Cosgrove, Deanshanger, Grafton Regis, Old Stratford, Paulerspury, Potterspury, Wicken and Yardley Gobion. Almost all these villages are served by the 89 bus between Towcester and Milton Keynes and secondary school children in the area attend the Deanshanger campus of Elizabeth Woodville School. There are good road links within the ward along the A508 road and the A5 road (following the course of Watling Street.)

Whilst it would theoretically be possible to propose a pattern of two single-member wards here, this would require separating Deanshanger from Old Stratford (with which Deanshanger shares close links, especially to the village of Passenham within the Old Stratford parish) and instead combining Deanshanger with Potterspury, which it has weaker links to. Accordingly, we feel that a two-member ward is the superior option. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 7% more electors than average.

We propose a three-member **Towcester & Silverstone** ward, covering the parishes of Silverstone, Towcester and Whittlebury. Towcester is a historic market town which has grown rapidly in recent decades and this development is ongoing in the south of town around Marie Weller Primary School. Its size makes it distinct from the surrounding villages, but unfortunately the town is too large to be represented by two councillors and too small to stand alone as a three-councillor ward. Accordingly, the question is which neighbouring villages are most similar to Towcester.

Our belief is that Silverstone and Whittlebury are the best candidates. Silverstone is a large village south of Towcester on the A43, which is nationally known as the location of the Silverstone Motor Racing Circuit, where the British Grand Prix is held. Motorsport engineering plays a major role in the local economy and the area centred on Silverstone is sometimes known as 'Motorsport Valley' in recognition of the concentration of such businesses in the area. This influence can also be seen in Towcester, where most of the streets on The Shires Estate are named after individuals known for their involvement in Formula 1. The medical centre in Silverstone is linked to the GP surgery in Towcester. Whittlebury is a smaller village east of Silverstone, close to the county boundary with Buckinghamshire. Its major transport links are north to Towcester. Secondary school pupils in all three settlements attend either Sponne School or Silverstone University Technical College. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 2% fewer electors than average.

We propose a three-member **Brackley** ward covering the civil parish of Brackley. At present Brackley is represented by three councillors and the only modifications we propose are a few small movements of electors to realign the ward pattern to the parish boundaries, none of which affect any electors. Brackley is a historic market town which has grown significantly in recent decades. It is served by four primary schools and by Magdalen College School for secondary pupils. It has strong boundaries on three sides formed by the A43 bypass and the A422 road and is clearly distinct from its rural hinterland. By 2028, councillors for this ward would represent 2% fewer electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Kings Sutton** ward, covering the parishes of Aynho, Croughton, Evenley, Farthinghoe, Hinton in the Hedges, Kings Sutton and Newbottle. This ward is made up of small villages to the south-west of Brackley. Because of its proximity to the M40 and the A43, many residents look towards Oxford and Banbury for services rather than elsewhere within West Northamptonshire. There are four primary schools within the ward (Farthinghoe Primary School, Kings Sutton Primary School, Newbottle and Charlton CoE Primary School and Croughton All Saints CoE Primary School) which take pupils from villages within the ward without a school of their own.

Kings Sutton has a railway station which is used by commuters from other villages within this ward. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 2% more electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Middleton Cheney** ward, covering the parishes of Chacombe, Marston St Lawrence, Middleton Cheney, Overthorpe, Thenford and Warkworth. 75% of electors live in Middleton Cheney itself and only Chacombe of the other parishes has a population above 250. Primary school children in the ward attend Chacombe CoE Primary School and Middleton Cheney Primary Academy, whilst secondary school pupils attend Chenderit School. Middleton Cheney offers a range of services to the surrounding areas including a library, post office and pharmacy. Middleton Cheney, Overthorpe and Warkworth previously formed a single-member district ward on South Northamptonshire district council. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 2% fewer electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Helmdon** ward made up of the parishes of Culworth; Greatworth and Halse; Helmdon; Moreton Pinkney; Radstone; Sulgrave; Syresham; Thorpe Mandeville; Wappenham; Weston and Weedon; and Whitfield. This ward is made up of small villages to the north of Brackley. There are four primary schools within the ward, namely Greatworth Primary; Helmdon Primary; Culworth CoE Primary; and Syresham St James CoE Primary. Pupils from villages elsewhere in the ward predominantly attend one of these schools. The HS2 railway line is currently being constructed through this ward and concerns about this are a shared interest for the villages. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 2% fewer electors than average.

We propose a single member **Greens Norton** ward made up of the parishes of Abthorpe; Adstone; Blakesley; Bradden; Cold Higham; Greens Norton; Litchborough; Maidford; Pattishall; Slapton; Tiffield; and Woodend. This ward is made up of villages to the east of Towcester in close proximity to the A5 Watling Street. Most of the villages are very small, although both Greens Norton and Pattishall have populations above 1000. Because of the sparse population, the ward is served by only three primary schools (Blakesley CoE Primary; Greens Norton CoE Primary and Pattishall CoE Primary. Greens Norton has a post office which is convenient for the rest of the ward. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 3% more electors than average.

We propose a single-member **Bugbrooke** ward comprised of the parishes of Bugbrooke; Gayton; Nether Heyford; Rothersthorpe; and Upper Heyford. This ward would cover villages to the south of Northampton which are separated from the town by the M1 and remain essentially rural settlements. Secondary school children attend Campion School in Bugbrooke, and the Grand Union Canal runs through the ward. By 2028, the councillor for this ward would represent 6% more electors than average.

**How do I enter my electorate data?**

- 1: Type in all your data, by polling district, in sheet "Electoral data". Use the left-hand table, which is columns B to I.
- 2: It's important that every polling district is listed separately. Use your polling district code to identify polling districts in column B. If you have another description, or something else that you think would be helpful in order to identify the area, put this in column C.
- 3: If the polling district is in a parish, fill in the columns for parish (column D) and parish ward (column E). If there are no parish wards in the parish, or the polling district is in an unparished area, leave this blank.
- 4: If the polling district is in a parish which is part of a joint or grouped parish council, fill in the name of this group in column F. Make sure that this column is filled in for all parishes in the group.
- 5: Fill in the existing ward name in column G.
- 6: Enter the current electorate figures for each polling district. Then enter the figures which are predicted for five years. Although we recognise that you will be using a particular formula or method to work out these projections, make sure that the figures are rounded to a whole number before entering them in the spreadsheet. All polling districts should contain an approximate number of whole electors rather than fractions of electors. We work out the predicted electorate of the parishes, district wards and county divisions by building up from polling districts.

**How do I check my data?**

- 1: If you would like to check your data, use the table on the right. Above the right-hand table is a box called "Check my data". This shows you the total number of electors in all the polling districts. If this isn't right then there is a mistake in the left-hand table.
- 2: Once you have entered all the electoral data in columns B to I, then put in the names of the wards in column K. The spreadsheet will match what you type in column K to what you put in column G. It will add up the electorates of the polling districts in each ward.
- 3: In column L enter the number of councillors for each ward. Once all the numbers are entered, you will be able to see whether the ward is over-represented or under-represented, and by what percentage. (This will only work when the number of councillors has been filled in for all wards.)
