Objecting to the Proposal for Coalway Road, Goldthorn Hill Waverley Crescent, Malbrook Drive and Coton Road to be taken off Penn Ward ! I am fighting for the decision to be reversed, we wish to maintain our Penn Ward boundaries the way they currently are, so that the properties around Penn Ward do not become vulnerable to depreciation, plus other disadvantages that could occur due to the mixing up of boundaries. I do not agree that Graiseley and Blakenhall have greater community linkages to the areas that have been proposes to be taken off Penn Ward. The Coalway Road offers a clear boundary between Penn and Graiseley and the Goldthorn Hill offers a clear boundary between Penn and Blakenhall.. If the current proposal goes ahead Penn will no longer have clear boundaries. Penn Ward Boundaries should be maintained as they currently are. Penn Ward has similarities with Merr Hill, Tettenhal Regis and Tettenhal Wightwick and these three Wards are already recommended by LGBCE and local council to remain as they are. The test around clear boundaries is definitely compromised as relinquishing both sides of the Coalway Road to Graiseley, and taking both sides of Goldthorn Hill and Coton Road to Blakenhall ;leaves Penn Ward no Strong, clearly-identifiable boundaries. The other test around 'reflecting community' identity has been ignored Penn Ward will lose its well -loved and only Catholic Church in our community. St. Michael's Church at the moment comes under the Penn Ward and a lot of Penn Residents are proud of this local community Church. Penn Ward has some lovely shops like Tantastic and all the other shops around it on the corner of Coalway Road. These shops are well used by local people and these nice unique shops are part of the 'Character of Penn Ward' The community shopping area fits in well with Penn Ward.
