### Comment text:

I believe the proposals to create a new Much Woolton and Hunts Cross ward are largely ludicrous. While I accept the need for electoral equality and change the number of councillors overall. It is very clear that the Woolton area has been completely ripped apart compared to nearby areas. I live in the Much Woolton and Hunts Cross current proposed ward. I consider myself as a Wooltonian. I have no affinity with the Hunts Cross community - although I visit there occasionally. Where I live in the 'Much Woolton' area has more of a affinity with the proposed Woolton Park ward instead. Woolton as a community goes back hundreds of years. The idea that Hunts Cross has any bearing with the Woolton area shows a real lack of understanding about the local community. I give you the example of the Co-op food store by Hunts Cross station. A couple of years ago the store had a bit of a rebrand. They named it 'Co-op Woolton'. As such, many residents in the Hunts Cross area became so annoyed as they shop was very clearly not in Woolton. So much so that the Co-op changed its store name to Hunts Cross instead. There is a very clear dividing line between the two communities and that is the golf club. A clear marking point that divides people from both communities. So, I propose two things to keep the historic communities of Woolton together. 1) The Much Woolton area is integrated into the current proposed Woolton Park ward - securing its historic identity (with the boundary being the golf course) or 2) The Woolton Park proposed ward is integrated with the proposed Much Woolton and Hunts Cross Ward to create a new 3 councillor 'Woolton and Hunts Cross' ward. Therefore keeping the historic Woolton communities together, not changing the number of councillors overall as part of the proposals and still keeping the Hunts Cross part linked. Thank you.
