Subject: Review Submission from the Ettington Parish Council

At its Ordinary Meeting held on 13th October Ettington Parish Council resolved that its opposition to the Commission's proposal for the Stratford upon Avon District ward boundaries be conveyed as under:

Ettington Parish Council rejects the recommendation for a new Treddington Ward.

The present Ettington Ward consists of a cluster of rural villages most of which share boundaries with Ettington Parish itself, the exceptions being (in descending order of remoteness) Barcheston, Preston on Stour, Honington and Idlicote.

The communities in the parishes of Alderminster, Halford and The Pillertons have a particular bond with that of Ettington as they are feeder villages for Ettington's primary school. There is considerable merit in this group being represented at District level by the same Councillor.

The Parish of Ettington has about as much in common with Stretton on Fosse as it does with Cirencester which is also on the A429. That Halford, which actually straddles the A429, is not included in the proposed Tredington Ward but finds itself in Tysoe Ward is baffling.

A slimmed down version of the existing Ettington Ward shedding Barcheston (better off with Shipston) and Preston on Stour (diverted to Quinton) would have by 2020 AD reckoning an aggregate of 2648 electors. This would preserve the objective of electorate numerical equality, the proposed Tredington Ward yielding the not dissimilar total of 2711.

Ettington Parish Council is supportive of its District Council's proposal which advocated a large rural ward rather than The Boundaries Commission's proposal

The concept of a rural grouping with one parish at its nucleus is more sensible geographically for its ward member than that of a long ribbon involving greater travel needs.
