

LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN HEALTH ACT 2007

The Bassetlaw District Council (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2022

Made 1st August 2022 Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

Bassetlaw District Council ("the Council"), in accordance with section 82 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 ("the 2007 Act"), has undertaken a community governance review and made recommendations dated 23rd June 2022.

The Council has decided to give effect to those recommendations and, in accordance with section 93 of the 2007 Act, has consulted with the local government electors and other interested persons and has had regard to the need to secure that community governance reflects the identities and interests of the community and is effective and convenient.

The Council, in accordance with section 100 of the 2007 Act, has had regard to guidance issued under that section.

The Council makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 86 and 240(10) of the 2007 Act.

1. Citation and commencement

- (1) This Order may be cited as the Bassetlaw District Council (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2022.
- (2) This Order comes into force on the day after it is made.

2. Interpretation

In this Order -

"district" means the district of Bassetlaw;

"existing" means existing on the date this Order is made;

"map" means the relevant map marked "Map referred to in the Bassetlaw District Council (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2022" and numbered 1 and 2 (as the context allows) and deposited in accordance with section 96(4) of the 2007 Act:

"registration officer" means an officer appointed for the purpose of, and in accordance with, section 8 of the Representation of the People Act 1983.

3. Effect of Order

This Order has effect subject to any agreement under section 99 (agreements about incidental matters) of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 relevant to any provision of this Order.

4. The Parish boundary between Carlton in Lindrick and the unparished area of Worksop

That the parish boundary between Carlton-in-Lindrick Parish and the unparished area of Worksop in the vicinity of Thievesdale Lane and Blyth Road be moved to enable the new development to move out of Carlton-in-Lindrick Parish and into Worksop (Marked A on Map 1) and this proposal does not require other changes to the existing governance arrangements for the parish affected.

- **5. The Number of parish councillors for the parish of Rampton and Woodbeck** The number of councillors to be elected for the parish of Rampton and Woodbeck shall be increased from 7 to 8. This will be effective from the ordinary day of election in 2023.
- 6. Amalgamation of existing parishes of Norton and Cuckney and Holbeck and Welbeck and constitution of new parish of Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck Parish
- (1) The existing parishes of Norton and Cuckney and Holbeck and Welbeck shall be amalgamated to constitute a new parish comprising the area outlined in red on Map 2.
- (2) The new parish shall be known as Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck Parish.
- (3) In consequence of paragraph (1), the existing parishes of Cuckney and Norton & Holbeck and Welbeck shall cease to exist.
- (4) The number of councillors to be elected for the Parish of Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck will be 12.
- (5) The election of all parish councillors for the Parish of Norton and Cuckney shall be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2023.
- (6) The annual meeting of the new parish council in 2023 shall be convened by the Clerk Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck Parish Council. The meeting shall take place no later than 14 days after the day on which the councillors elected to the new parish council take office.
- (7) All the land, property, rights and liabilities of Norton and Cuckney Parish Council and Holbeck and Welbeck Parish Council shall transfer from those councils to the new Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck Parish Council.
- (8) Until the parish councillors elected to the new Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck Parish Council at the elections to be held on the ordinary day of election in 2023 come into office, the new parish shall be represented by those persons who immediately before 1st April 2023 are elected parish councillors for the existing parishes of Norton and Cuckney and Holbeck and Welbeck.

7. Electoral register

The registration officer for the district shall make such rearrangement of, or adaptation of, the register of local government electors as may be necessary for the purposes of, and in consequence of, this Order.

8. Order date

1st April 2023 is the order date for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) (England) Regulations 2008.


