


Our Recommendations

Final Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors on the council.
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Buckinghamshire?

- The Commission is carrying out an electoral review of Buckinghamshire Council to deliver electoral equality for electors across Buckinghamshire, after being established as a unitary authority.

Our proposals

- Buckinghamshire Council currently has 147 councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 97 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
 2. Reflect community interests and identities
 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all the submissions we received during our consultation on our draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that Buckinghamshire should have 97 councillors, a decrease of 50.

Buckinghamshire should have 49 wards. The boundaries of all of the existing wards should change.

The 97 councillors should represent ten three-councillor wards, 28 two-councillor wards and eleven single-councillor wards.


Stage of Review	Description
7 September - 2 November 2021	Public consultation on councillor numbers
11 January - 4 April 2022	Public consultation on warding arrangements
2 August - 5 December 2022	Public consultation on draft recommendations
28 February 2023 - 10 April 2023	Limited further public consultation on our proposals
May 2023	Publication of final recommendations
May 2025	Subject to parliamentary approval - implementation of new arrangements at local elections
