- . Whyteleafe, sports and recreation ground (the rec)was purchased by the residents of Whyteleafe in 1924, and held in trust for the outdoor recreational use of Whyteleafe inhabitants.It is therefore illegal for the Boundry commission to assign this essential facility to Warlingham.
2. The wreck is the only outdoor recreational facility with a children's play area in Whyteleafe.
Whyteleafe is a growing community with many young families with children who live in the newly built flats and apartments These young families do not have gardens in their properties and without the rec would have no open space or play area for the children. It would therefore be the removal of a critical Whyteleafe facility that helps the health and well-being of many young families.
3. The roads adjacent to Godstone Road, including Downsway, Maple Road, Maple close, and Hillview are an integral part of Whyteleafe as they are. They are within the natural Whyteleafe Valley. These roads are far away from the Warlingham centre and the residents do not see themselves as Warlingham residents.
4. The houses in Portley Wood a large multi million pound houses mansions and do not fit the regular Whyteleafe residential model.
5. The proposed boundary changes contravene a number of the major commitments made in the joint neighbourhood plan that was approved by referendum in 2021 and adopted by Tandridge District Council.
