Thrupp and Brimscombe are an integral part of the Stroud 5 valley structure. I and many neighbours regularly visit Minchinhampton and Chalford for shopping, cafes, walks, exercise classes, pubs and restaurants- mostly within an easy cycle or walk for the fitter amongst us.

We generally do not visit Bisley or Painswick.

We share with Minchinhampton and Chalford local road closures such as the recent A419 roadworks. Some of our children go to local schools. No one in their right mind would drive up Claypits lane off Thrupp Lane (single track and extremely steep and twisty)to get to Bisley or painswick. I go through Stroud, or through Eastcombe.

Our problems are different to the smaller more rural communities of Bisley and Painswick and need different local councillors to understand their needs. Changes in Bisley and Painswick do not affect us- but changes in Minchinhampton and Chalford certainly do. Please drop this ridiculous boundary change, and leave us with our excellent current councillor.
