Related subject: Stony Stratford and Loughton ward boundary

Dear Sirs,

Having looked at what is proposed by this review, I wish to comment on the proposed southern boundary between Stony Stratford and Loughton Wards.

I note that one of the main drivers for change is to seek balance in the number of electors across wards. However, in this case that proposal delivers a boundary that winds and twists its way through streets within the new Whitehouse housing development that is still under construction. An invisible boundary that bites into a small northern part of this new and still growing development makes no sense and will cause confusion for local communities, especially in Whitehouse as to which local council has responsibility for precepting and services etc delivered by the first tier of local government ie Stony Town and Whitehouse Community councils.

A far better and more logical boundary would be that provided by Calverton Lane and Stratford Road (southbound) that lies a short distance to the north. This not only mirrors the line of the proposed boundary but importantly, it has the attraction of a boundary that is clearly defined by physical features, a time honoured principle used in mapping for many centuries and one that is unlikely to change.
