**Related subject:** Bradville

To quote the summary document:

“A good pattern of wards should:

... Reflect community interests and identities and include evidence of community links.”

As well as New Bradwell, the community interests and identities of the people of Bradville are bound to be much more aligned and integrated with those of their geographical neighbours in such similar areas as Stantonbury and Great Linford, than with those of such distant and rural places as Hanslope.

“Transport links: are there good links across your proposed ward? Is there any form of public transport?”

A cursory Internet search discloses no direct public transport between Bradville and the more northerly parts of the proposed ward such as Hanslope. It appears that to get there by bus one must first go to Central Milton Keynes. (Google Maps tells us to drive.)

“Community groups: is there a parish council, residents association or another group that represents the area?”

Given the point about community interests and identities, there is unlikely to be any such group that represents the proposed ward area.

“Facilities: does your pattern of wards reflect where local people go for shops, medical services, leisure facilities etc.?”

The proposed ward largely does not reflect this. Bradville people mostly go Great Linford Local Services and the Aldi at Stantonbury for local shops, and these both fall outside of the proposed new ward.
