Newton-in-the -Isle: under the proposals the village continues to be linked with Tydd, the closest parish to Newton-in-the-Isle.

Tydd: under the proposals the village continues to be linked with Newton and Gorefield, the closest parishes to Tydd.

Gorefield: under the proposals the village is linked with similar rural areas in Parson Drove, Tydd and Newton.

Leverington: the proposals recognise how close Leverington is to Peckover.

Parson Drove: the proposal links the village with Gorefield, Tydd and Newton which are very similar settlements.

Wisbech St Mary: both Wisbech St Mary and Elm parishes are made up of several mostly rural villages which share many issues and concerns.

Elm: Elm shares with Wisbech St Mary, as parishes, that they are made up of several relatively small rural villages.

Christchurch: historically, Christchurch was in a County Council Division with March East, and Christchurch looks to March as its nearest local town for all services unavailable in the village.

Manea: Manea has close links with Chatteris - much of the Parish of Manea (the How Fen area) was part of the Town of Chatteris until 2015.

Wimblington: Wimblington and Doddington are very similar in size and nature and fit well together in a two-member ward.

Doddington: Wimblington and Doddington are very similar in size and nature and fit well together in a two-member ward.

Benwick: Benwick is admittedly too small to be a ward on its own, and the village has historically been connected with West March in a County Division. Benwick looks towards March as its nearest local town for all services unavailable in the village.

Wisbech: in Wisbech, the proposed boundaries reflect and respect local communities within the Town.

March: the proposals put forward by FDC reflect the strong boundaries within the town created by the river and by the Isle of Ely Way.

Chatteris: The boundaries in Chatteris reflect local communities.

Whittlesey: There are strong and clearly identifiable boundaries in the Town.
