Final Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

Why Brighton & Hove?

- The Commission has a legal duty to carry out an electoral review of each council in England 'from time to time'.
- Brighton & Hove City Council has not been reviewed since 2001 and the Commission has therefore decided that it should review Brighton & Hove in advance of the elections in 2023.

Our proposals

- Brighton & Hove City Council currently has 54 councillors. Based on the evidence we received, we recommend that 54 councillors should serve the council in the future.
- We believe our final recommendations meet our statutory criteria to:
 - 1. Deliver electoral equality for electors
 - 2. Reflect community interests and identities
 - 3. Promote effective and convenient local government

Summary of our recommendations

We have considered all of the submissions we received during our consultations on our draft and further draft recommendations.

The final recommendations propose that Brighton & Hove City Council should have 54 councillors, the same as there are now.

Brighton & Hove should have 23 wards, an increase of two from the current arrangements. The boundaries of 16 wards will change, five will remain the same.

The 54 councillors should represent eight three-councillor wards and 15 two-councillor wards across the city.
