## Gloucestershire County Council LGBCE 2023 Review

### Gloucestershire County Labour Group – initial consultation comments June 2023

Thank you launching this review and inviting initial comments. These initial comments respond to the challenge of creating 11 electoral divisions (rather than the current 10) within the Stroud District Council boundary whilst seeking to address the considerations and criteria to be applied.

We have particular knowledge of these areas as four out of the five members of our political group represent County Council seats within Stroud District.

Our methodology has been to apply the proposed number of 55 councillors to the projected 2029 electorate of 522,747, which gives a county average of 9,504. We have then looked at a range of options that would be within the range of +10% or -10% of this figure, whilst taking into account the other criteria.

Based on this we attach a version of your data file with tabs inserted for each of the 11 divisions together with a map showing these. In summary these give as below.

**Cam Valley** – this is an area of significant current and future planned growth. In order to contain this ED within a 10% variance, we have suggested removing Polling District BVG Hinton and BVF Hamfallow, whilst leaving BVE Hamfallow in the Cam Valley ED. This would mean that two EDs would cover Hamfallow Parish, however, having considered the alternatives, this is necessary in order to maintain a contiguous area which includes the town of Berkeley whilst keeping just under the +10% variance at +9.4% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Dursley** – this proposal retains Dursley Town and runs northward to include, as now, the parishes of Frocester and Leonard Stanley. For reasons of numerical balance it removes, however, Polling District CUC Owlpen to Wotton-Under-Edge ED. The latter is arguable, however, we calculate that retaining the 37 electors in CUC in the

Dursley ED would push Wotton Under Edge ED marginally over the variance at 10.1%. The proposed Dursley ED would have a variance of -7.6% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Hardwicke and Severn** – this proposal retains this division running alongside the Severn Estuary with the changes being the addition of Polling Districts BVG Hinton and BVF Hamfallow (from Cam Valley ED) and removal of Polling District HF Hunts Grove. The latter is a significant area of residential development which we propose forms part of what we refer to as Stroud North ED, which is in effect the new 11<sup>th</sup> ED. The proposed Hardwicke and Severn ED would have a variance of -2.6% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Minchinhampton** – this proposal retains the Minchinhampton ED but with Polling Districts TB and TC from Brimscombe and Thrupp moved into an ED we refer to as Stroud East. This meets the criteria and contributes to a solution which creates the new 11<sup>th</sup> ED. The proposed Minchinhampton ED would have a variance of -4.2% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Nailsworth** – this proposal retains an ED with Nailsworth Town and the parishes of Horsley, Woodchester and Kings Stanley together with Polling District AWA Amberley. The proposed Nailsworth ED would have a variance of -5.6% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Rodborough** – this proposal retains an ED consisting of Cainscross Parish and Rodborough District Ward. The Polling Districts TA would, however, be moved into an ED we refer to as Stroud East. TA is the Rodborough Butterow Parish Ward which forms part of Thrupp District Ward. Our proposal would also move RWRA, the Randwick South East Parish Ward into what we refer to as the Stroud North ED, which is in effect the new 11<sup>th</sup> ED. These changes better balance numbers and achieve the overall solution required. The proposed Rodborough ED would have a variance of -4.5% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Stonehouse** – this proposal retains an ED consisting of Stonehouse Town and Eastington Parish. The Polling District HI, which is Standish Parish, would, however, be moved into what we refer to as the Stroud North ED, which is in effect the new 11<sup>th</sup> ED. These changes better balance numbers and achieve the overall solution required. The proposed Stonehouse ED would have a variance of -0.7% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Stroud Central** – this proposal would retain five of the six District Wards in Stroud Town whilst moving Stroud Trinity Ward (Polling District STTA) which would form part of the ED we refer to as Stroud East. A large part of the area of Stroud Trinity ward is rural in character and similar to the adjacent Thrupp ward. In addition Bisley Road and Middle Street form a well-defined border for the most part between Trinity Ward and the rest of Stroud Town. This change better balance numbers and helps achieve the overall solution required. The proposed Stroud Central ED would have a variance of -8.8% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Stroud East** – this ED would be formed from parts of the current Painswick and Bisley ED together with the additions of SSTA Stroud Trinity and Brimscombe and



Thrupp District Ward (Polling Districts TA, TB and TC), with TA being the Rodborough Butterow Parish Ward currently in Rodborough ED. The Upton St Leonards Polling Districts PUH and PUI would become part of the new Stroud North ED. These changes better balance numbers and achieve the overall solution required to create an 11<sup>th</sup> ED. The proposed Stroud East ED would have a variance of -3.9% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Stroud North** – this is in effect the new 11<sup>th</sup> ED consisting of the Stroud District parts of the settlements that border Gloucester and Tewkesbury Borough and areas southward to Stroud Town's northern boundary. This includes areas of current and planned residential expansion of Hunts Grove HF and Coopers Edge within Upton St Leonards Ward, together with parishes of Brookthorpe, Harescombe, Harsefield, Edge, Standish, Randwick and Whiteshill. The proposed Stroud North ED would have a variance of -0.8% against the 2029 projected county average.

**Wotton Under Edge** – this proposal retains an ED focused on the town of Wotton Under Edge with the addition, from Dursley ED, of Polling District CUC Owlpen. This consists of a large estate and has a 2029 projection of just 37 electors. Inclusion of CUC is arguable, however, we calculate that placing this in the Wotton Under Edge ED would keep it marginally under the variance range at +9.7% against the 2029 projected county average.
