Related subject: Oundle

I feel that the Commission's proposed Oundle ward covers too large a geographical area. The communities in the north west of the proposed ward are on the A43 corridor and, as such, are distinctive from other rural villages in the proposed ward. There is little in common between these areas and Oundle and its surrounding villages.

In the draft recommendations, the Commission says: 'we note that it would be possible to construct a two-member ward focused on the town of Oundle and neighbouring parishes, and a single-member ward comprising rural parishes further north'.

I believe that the proposed Oundle ward should be divided as follows. The first number indicates the current number of electors and the second number includes the Commission's projection for 2028.
